Disclaimer: Please recognize that I am not a Medical Doctor. I have been an avid student researching and studying prostate cancer as a survivor and continuing patient since 1992. **The comments or recommendations I make are not intended to be the procedure for you to now follow; rather, they are to be reviewed along with the comments or recommendations of others for your own further research, study, and discussion with the physician providing your prostate cancer care to come to your own, personal conclusion.**

I have often been asked how I determine “my personal opinion” “Best Among the Rest” physicians:

I have been deeply involved in research and study of prostate cancer since 1996 when I experienced my cancer recurrence. At the same time I have been monitoring and responding to posts on the various prostate cancer support lists. And, I have been attending annual conferences on prostate cancer where I had the opportunity to meet and listen to presentations made at those conferences by physicians that were selected for those presentations based on their well known expertise in research and treatment of our insidious disease.

During these several years we regularly see the recommendation to patients, particularly newly diagnosed or those with recurring disease, to seek out physicians with known expertise in whichever treatment option the patient may be interested (surgery, radiation, cryosurgery, androgen deprivation, chemotherapy, Active Surveillance, erectile dysfunction, incontinence, and-you-name-it). And, it became obvious that little was known by most posting on the several support lists as to just who are those physicians with such expertise. With that recognition, I began assembling “my” personal opinion list of physicians I had found could be considered “Best Among The Rest” as regards prostate cancer that I could then pass on to those interested. I included physicians who had been invited because of their expertise to provide presentations at these annual national conferences, physicians who their colleagues recommended, and physicians whom I had learned from at least three or more patients as having provided excellent administration of

treatment procedures, and with no reasonable adverse reports. I then looked up these physicians to learn of papers they may have written and to have an idea of how long they had been in practice.

Most certainly there are likely many others that I have not yet met, heard, or been recommended by either colleagues or at least three patients.

ROBOTIC LAPAROSCOPIC RADICAL PROSTATECTOMY

BRACHYTHERAPY SEED IMPLANTS/EXTERNAL BEAM RADIATION THERAPY (EBRT)

FLORIDA

His presentations at National Conferences on Prostate Cancer catch the attention of everyone present. (Image Guided Radiotherapy has the ability to show the soft tissue anatomy and pinpoint radiation treatment exactly where it is required, so there are almost no side effects). F18 PET/CT bone scan and Endorectal Coil MRI are also available locally if required. In my opinion, the equipment present in the Dattoli Cancer Center is state-of-the-art unlikely to be present at any other facility treating PC with Brachytherapy seed implants. And Dr. Dattoli and his staff have proven their expertise with exceptional outcomes. A visit to www.dattoli.com should provide you the assurance you might require that if your option choice is brachytherapy seed implants accompanied by IG-IMRT and possibly short term ADT to insure all areas in which PC may be present are attacked, a trip to Sarasota would be an excellent choice. You can either find contact information on the website to discuss your concerns with a representative or you can email Dr. Dattoli's oncology nurse, Jennifer Cash, MS/ARNP/OCN, at www.brachyyn@aol.com who offered her consult when I met her and Dr. Dattoli at a conference. I believe they offer support in finding least expensive

accommodations while there for treatment and you could also ascertain if your insurance coverage is accepted there (Medicare IS accepted).

I have been on this treatment for about five years. I like the fact that I don't have to worry about osteoporosis. I don't have hot flashes. I have better quality sleep than I ever had during the years I was on Lupron. Furthermore I retain some libido and the ability to have orgasms. Lastly estradiol is cognitively protective. I greatly favor the gel over patches as it is much easier to manage. Talk this option over with your MD. He is welcome to contact me for more information. I summarized the information on this topic for a prostate cancer conference about a year ago and that summary can be found at: www.ppml-info.org/TDE.pdf. The case against transdermal estradiol of course is that it cuts back greatly the amount of money an MD can make compared to giving LHRH agonists injections. So lots of MDs will favor the LHRH injections. You should only go on estradiol with an MDs supervision. However the titrating is MUCH easier with the gel than the patches.”

PATHOLOGY:

Importance of Expert Pathology Opinion:

Despite the fact that the Gleason score might NOT change after an expert review, the reality is that more often it does. However, the issue is who did the first review. There are talented pathologists who are focused on prostate cancer and also two national labs who are focused on PC as well.

The Gleason score is a critical item; it is used as a variable in virtually every prognostic and treatment algorithm. An accurate GS mandates an expert pathology opinion from a PC pathology expert. The ones that I am most familiar with include:

A second opinion on the microscopic pathology is usually covered by insurance but if not, runs about \$500 pending on what is done. A copy of the original pathology report with the actual slides or recuts from the tissue block are sent to the outside reviewer. Your primary care doctor or you can initiate such a 2nd opinion but you need to request this and ask for a specific physician or lab to be used.

18F-FLUORIDE PET/CT SCAN

A bone scan with technetium 99 is not likely to show pathology at low level PSA, whereas 18F-Fluoride PET/CT has this capability. PET scanning in general (including FDG PET) and 18F-Fluoride PET are not to be confused with 18F-Fluoride PET/CT. The latter is the technique recommended for acquiring images and combining images to identify early developing bone metastases as well as scanning lymph nodes, and is available at only a few locations. Below are a few of which I am aware. This was info from a few years back, so likely many other facilities now have 18F-Fluoride PET/CT capability.
